

# **CLEAN SLATE 3.0**

**Expands record-sealing eligibility** in Pennsylvania
starting Feb. 12, 2024

#### **RECORD-SEALING**

Many non-violent **felony** convictions can be sealed after 10 years

- Drug & property-related (like theft)
- Crime-free for 10 years

Many misdemeanor convictions may be sealed after 7 years.

Summary convictions will be sealed automatically after 5 years. (starts June 2024)

A sealed record cannot be seen on most background checks (except FBI).

If a conviction is not sealed automatically, a petition needs to be filed in court.

#### **EXPUNGEMENTS**

Only non-conviction charges, including ARD, or summary convictions with no arrests in the past 5 years can be expunged.

(Note: felony and misdemeanor convictions cannot be expunged until you are at least 70 years old, unless you first receive a pardon.)



# **CLEAN SLATE 3.0**

**Expands record-sealing** eligibility in Pennsylvania starting Feb. 12, 2024

#### LOW-LEVEL FELONY CONVICTIONS

## can be sealed, after 10 years:

- Many drug crimes with shorter sentences
- Theft, including retail theft and receiving stolen property
- Trespass
- Forgery & fraud, including access/device fraud. bad checks, ID theft & welfare fraud
- Criminal mischief
- Conspiracy to commit an eligible crime

## MOST MISDEMEANOR CONVICTIONS can be sealed after 7 years

- Recklessly endangering another person
- Simple assault
- DUI
- Disorderly conduct
- Resisting arrest
- Harassment
- Terroristic threats
- Possession of an instrument of a crime
- Prostititution

## SUMMARY CONVICTIONS will be sealed automatically after 5 years

Starts June 2024

#### **BENEFITS**

Record-sealing helps people get better opportunities for jobs, housing & education.

Sealed records do not need to be disclosed, unless required by federal law.
